Finding creative ways of reaching non-literate people will be central to your work.
Facilitate prayer advocates on the field and around the world to raise awareness and interest in the people group.
Supervise media development in a group of languages.

Organisational skills and ability to manage others.
Teaching skills.

Requirements

Willingness to learn one or two local languages.
Willingness to serve under national leadership.
Integrating radio/cassette ministry with on the ground ministries.
Willingness and ability to train local folk in your skills.
Instigate evangelistic and holistic initiatives into your programming.
Willingness to work with other partners.

Platform

It may be difficult to obtain a work permit to function in a religious context in the country, so an alternative job or platform is needed to obtain a visa. In this situation, the worker will be required to provide a service to the country, eg teaching, training, consultant to private or public institutions.
